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Sometimes known as Dialogue Evangelism, these events are both effective evangelism and excellent training for Apprentices. Unbelievers have fairly standard questions about the faith, which need to be answered and Apprentices should learn to deal with these questions effectively.

Exercise

To conduct Question and Answer evangelism events.

Aims

- 1. To prepare answers for the standard questions about Christianity.
- 2. To learn to field questions in evangelistic events, both personal and public.

Apprentices

- 1. Identify the main questions and objections about the gospel.
- 2. Develop answers and approaches to these questions.
- 3. Think through the possible motivations of those asking questions.
- 4. Set up a Q & A Event following these guidelines
 - The aim is to have about 5 unbelievers with 5 Christians meeting for 1-2 hours.
 - The easiest way to do this is to persuade a regular Bible study group to conduct such an event.
 - The Apprentice gives a short talk to explain the gospel and stimulate questions.
 - The Apprentice then fields the questions, followed by supper or whatever.

Trainers

- Conduct a Q & A Event with Apprentice observing.
- Conduct a Q & A Event with Apprentice answering one or two questions.
- Sit in on the Apprentice Q & A Event and give feedback after.
