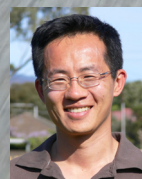

What is MAP?

What is the Ministry Apprenticeship Program?

MAP is a two-year, full time apprenticeship in pastoral ministry working with a church or para-church organisation.

Why should I do MAP?

- * MAP is a fantastic way to learn 'on the job' and to assess your suitability for vocational ministry.
- * MAP gives an outstanding preparation for a lifetime of vocational ministry as a trainer of God's people.
- * MAP will help you to define the right pastoral questions to be asking at Bible College.

Since its inception in 1999, nearly 40 South Australian men and women from a variety of church backgrounds have participated in MAP and are now serving God throughout His world...

Key Features:

Key Features of the Ministry Apprenticeship Program include:

- * the opportunity to work 'hands-on' with an experienced ministry trainer
- * the provision of real areas of responsibility in a supervised and safe environment
- * weekly participation in a formal training program with other apprentices under the guidance of experienced ministry innovators (*see sample curriculum*)
- * formal six-monthly reviews to enable ongoing personal development
- * invaluable experience in building long-term gospel partnerships (Ministry Apprentices receive a basic living allowance and are responsible for raising a proportion of this support)

Formal Training and Curriculum:

The formal MAP training program is 2 hours weekly during school term, and has a curriculum which covers four broad topic areas:

Personal Growth

- Spiritual life of the pastor
- Success and failure in ministry
- Christian leadership

Ministry Skills

- How to write a Bible Talk
- How to work in mixed-gender teams
- How to develop a church missions strategy

Theological Thought

- Thinking theologically
- Responding to universalism
- Developing a doctrine of scripture

Exposure to Broader Ministry

- Ministry to the poor and needy
- School chaplaincy
- Prison ministry

Ministry Apprentices will also read and discuss one Christian book each term and participate in 'practical sessions' (e.g. giving a Bible Talk).
