# **TE1.03 Expert in a New Testament Book**

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To complement the extensive Bible reading encouraged in MTS Training Exercise 1.03, the Apprentice will do an in-depth study of one New Testament book. The knowledge gained from this intensive study will reap benefits for the apprentice as they apply their preparation material in a variety of different teaching and ministry contexts.

### Exercise

Choose a particular New Testament book for intensive study and teaching of others over the two years.

### Aims

- 1. To learn skills in reading a book of the New Testament, such as:
  - analysing the structure and flow of argument
  - · determining the meanings of words
  - interpreting different types of literary forms and devices, such as: narrative, teaching, parable, poetry, apocalyptic
  - · interpreting quotations and allusions from the Old Testament
  - identifying major themes and the purpose of a book
  - summarising key doctrines
- 2. To become familiar with some of the tools available for New Testament study
- 3. To re-use the fruits of this study in a variety of teaching contexts during MTS, rather than preparing new studies each time. This efficiency in preparation time allows Apprentices to maximise their people-ministry time rather than spending hours preparing new material for every teaching occasion.

## Apprentices

- 1. Choose a New Testament book for intensive study
- 2. Do some initial study following the guidelines in Growth Groups, chapter 4 (see Resources)
- 3. Be discerning in the use of commentaries
- 4. Prepare a series of Bible studies to use in leading small groups and utilise these studies as often as possible during MTS
- 5. Use this study in one-to-one Bible reading during MTS
- 6. Give a Bible talk (or series of talks) from this New Testament book
- 7. Use the study of this book to prepare and teach Scripture lessons, Sunday School classes and youth Bible studies

#### **Trainers**

- Discuss with your Apprentice your own approach to intensive study of a New Testament book before a sermon series, including your use of commentaries etc.
- Note the Apprentice's increasing understanding of the book. Provide them with opportunities to use their new knowledge in a variety of contexts.
- Listen to a Bible study or talk from this study and give feedback.
